Patient Sees Her Artwork

Dolores Buchheit recently moved to Sumner and scheduled an appointment with Dr. Shanna Elliott in the CMH Medical Clinic.

When she arrived, Dr. Elliott shared that she had a surprise for Buchheit. Moments later, Buchheit was surprised to see her own artwork hanging on the walls outside the clinic.

Turns out, the artwork was right where it should be. A friend, Doug Cole, purchased the artwork from Buchheit years ago, and he told her it was for the new hospital in Sumner. However, time passed and Buchheit had forgotten about the project.

"I was surprised Doug purchased abstract pieces, which I rarely do," she said.

Buchheit grew up on a farm outside of St. Lucas with her 10 brothers and sisters. She remembered drawing anywhere she could despite not having art classes in school. Not long after giving birth to her youngest son in 1964, she was in a local store looking at art supplies. Someone asked if she was an artist and spoke with her about the Northeast lowa Art Association, which she then joined. In 1968, she sold her first piece of art.

In 1970, Dolores started to take art trips with friends from the Northeast Iowa Art Association. They traveled to Connecticut, North Carolina, Upper Peninsula Michigan and Arkansas to mention a few. They would spend two weeks outdoors and take lessons from artists from all over the world.

"My husband would tell me to go, and he would take care of the kids," she said. "He was always so supportive, and he was also my biggest critic."

In 1984, the couple opened a gallery in St. Lucas on their farm. Buchheit taught oil painting classes at Turkey Valley High School in the evening.

"God gave me this talent, and it should be shared with everyone," she says.

The ACR certification process involves a professional examination of imaging samples performed at our facility. Re-accreditation occurs every three years.

This shows our equipment is up-to-date and satisfies all performance standards, while ensuring optimal patient care and follow-up are provided.
